

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Petition Intake □ Upon receipt from USCIS, NVC starts pre-processing. □ Field-by-field data-entry. □ Assigns NVC case number. □ NVC can now answer case questions. □ Categorization depends on visa type. □ NVC will send the Welcome Letter by email or mail.



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Applicant Instructions — NVC Processing Check TSG for instructions on how to complete every-step of the process. Log in to CEAC to check case status, messages, and manage the case. Complete the following seven steps: Pay Fees Complete the Affidavit of Support Form Evidence Online Visa Application DS-260 Form Courselved Documents Occurrents Scan the Collect Collect Application DS-260 Form DS-260 Form Courselved Documents Occurrents Scanned Images

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Online Smart Form. Available for All Traveling Applicants. Available only in English. Print the Confirmation Page. NVC clerically reviews submitted forms for completeness.

Affidavit of Support Form



Submit all pages, even if they are blank.



AOS forms must be signed by the financial sponsor(s).



AOS forms valid indefinitely.



I-864W form is no longer required.



Public charge considerations by consular officers.



NVC clerically reviews submitted AOS forms for completeness.

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Document Collection



Region-Specific teams dedicated to understanding and working with specific countries.



Civil Documents must be issued by the foreign country issuing authority.



Use the Reciprocity Tables to learn the document's requirements for each country (nvc.state.gov/documents).



For unavailable documents submit a detailed written explanation to NVC.

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Document Scanning



Collect, Scan, and Save the forms and documents.



Submit all the Forms and Documents at the same time.



Use your smartphone to submit the documents to NVC.



Do Not Mail Documents to NVC (unless instructed).



Follow the Scanning Tips & Guidelines (nvc.state.gov/scan)

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Qualification for Interview

- · Cases must be documentarily complete.
- NVC completed administrative review when:
 - Fees are paid (IV fee + AOS fee)
 - All Documents are submitted:



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Visa Interviews Scheduled Monthly

• 144 embassies give NVC appointment dates & times • NVC schedules interview & sends appointment letter • NVC sends electronic file or physical file to embassy • Embassy interviews applicants

EXPEDITE APPROVAL AT USCIS DOES NOT MEAN IT WILL BE EXPEDITED AT DOS

PRESENT THE ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS AT THE INTERVIEW

NO WET SIGNATURE SIGNATURE ON AOS FORMS

SUBMIT EVERYTHING IN ONE SUBMISSION





AVOIDING TERMINATION

NVC CANNOT PREDICT WHEN AN INTERVIEW WILL BE SCHEDULED

NVC Timeframes









Timeframes are unique to each case, and they are always changing.

Timeframes depend on volumes from USCIS and case parties' responses. We are not where we want to be but are working hard to meet this goal. We post the processing dates online on a weekly basis.

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
